The Blur

Rip the motocross track or trail on your sport ATV with the Artrax MXtrax Racing tyre. The MXT-R rear tyre is built with a two-ply construction to keep your ATV light and powerful. An X-dog bone style tread pattern gives this ATV tyre the ability to flex in corners and keep you on track. Artrax wrapped the tread around the sidewall of the tyre for additional bite. And the tested tread design paired with the medium compound rubber provide an ATV tyre that is ideal for cross country, GNCC, and wet weather riding conditions.

Mike's take on the MXT-R

"Working with the guys at DRD Magazine does have it perks. Steve from Darbi Accessories dropped off a few sets of Artrax ATV tyres to test out. Who was I to turn an offer like that down?

"I've run these over every type of terrain and on 300cc to a 450cc sports quad with fantastic results, plus Vaughn Adams rode them to victory in the 2008 ATV Nationals at Patetonga. The front rubber is the best I've used, super-light



under steering with a strong tread pattern for a wide range of terrain from the dreaded soft sand to hard pack clay. The front set on my LT-Z400 are on their second season with little to no wear. The rears are also a long life tyre with a good strong sidewall for the continuous punishment that they receive.

"The tread depth is slightly shorter than 'Holeshots', so are better for running on harder surfaces and the tread blocks hold up well over the life of tyre. So if you're looking for new shoes for your beast, you can't afford to look past Artrax rubber from Darbi Accessories – whether it's race or recreational.

"So tell your local bike dealer to hook you up or contact Whyteline in Paeroa on 07 862 8783, or in the South Island phone Fitch racing – the price will blow you away! They also carry a good cross country tyre and motard tyre for the really nutty out there. Thanks Steve at Darbi for the wicked rubber.
